2022 Funding Round Information for Applicants

General Information

The Tindall Foundation funds in 2 separate ways:

1. Through a central fund which is administered from the Auckland office for **national based** funding.
2. Via Local Donation Managers who work across the country distributing funding on Tindall's behalf. The Local Donation Managers each focus distribution of funds in one of four categories – Faith based, Environmental, Eastern Pacific and **Regional**.

WestREAP and Buller REAP are a **Regional** Local Donation Manager (LDM) for the Tindall Foundation and have been since 2006. **This will be the funding you are applying for.** You or your organisation should apply directly to the local LDM not to the Tindall Foundation.

The West Coast Local Donation Manager committee is made up of the Chief Executives of WestREAP and Buller REAP, the Board Chair of Buller REAP, the Deputy Chair of WestREAP and a Greymouth community representative.

The West Coast funding round opens in July and closes on 31st October. The committee meet to discuss the applications mid-November and funding is distributed late November.

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The Good News 😊 Priorities: What we CAN fund...

Families

The Tindall Foundation's goal and focus is that tamariki/children, rangatahi/young people and their whānau/families are resilient, secure and thriving. Tindall funding prioritises whanau and families who experience multiple and intergenerational disadvantage.

The family priorities are as follows:

- Putting whanau/families at the centre
- Working holistically
- Addressing whanau/families experiencing multiple and inter-generational disadvantage
- Focus on long-term solutions
- Working collaboratively
- Using Kaupapa Maori models of practice

Community

The Tindall Foundation's goal and focus is that communities across Aotearoa New Zealand are flourishing, inclusive and connected. Tindall funding supports kaupapa Māori initiatives, community groups, and neighbourhoods to use their own strengths and find local solutions. People, Culture, Community - connection lies at the heart of well-being.

The community priorities are as follows:

- Solutions from within the community
- Promoting generosity
- Promoting neighbourliness
- Investing for impact
- Community led approach
- Celebrating and enhancing diversity
- Collaborating with others for greater impact
- Growing opportunities in economically deprived regions and communities

Tindall funding is granted on a 1-year basis and organisations can apply in subsequent years. Funding is typically only granted for 1-3 years however there is some leeway for an organisation to be funded to a maximum of 5 years if the project and or organisation are providing an invaluable and non-duplicated service within a community.

Exclusions: What we can't fund...

We will spend around 50% of our yearly funding budget on Families projects that help us deliver our hopes for Aotearoa New Zealand. However, we are unable to fund the following:

- **Core or public health services:** medical care, medical equipment, medical research, clinical health initiatives (within mental or physical health) or disabilities services, hospitals and hospices. This includes initiatives where the 'entry criteria' for service users means that they have a physical, mental health or addiction issue or are living with a disability.
- **Core education:** in universities, colleges, schools, early childhood centres, including programmes, scholarships, equipment, or other activities that are curriculum related.
- **Research:** from outside a community without its direct involvement.
- **Sport, leisure and recreation:** high performance sport, sports clubs operational or programme costs, sport equipment, events, trips and competitions.
- **The Arts:** including drama, art or performing arts, museums and galleries.
- **Overseas** organisations, projects outside the geographic borders of Aotearoa New Zealand, overseas travel and expenses, and exchange programmes.
- **Buildings/land**
- **Animal charities.**
- **Capital assets** or equipment costing over \$3,000.
- **Individuals:** We are unable to give donations to support individuals including scholarships, international travel to conferences, events or for research.
- **Personal loans**
- **Endowment funds.**
- **Religious or political advocacy:** including religious advancement, political lobby groups, lobbying or marketing campaigns.
- **Venture capital initiatives.**
- **Urgent or retrospective applications.**
- **Sponsorships.**
